YEAR 8

In Hall Assessments

As mentioned in previous weeks, students are to sit in hall assessments next week. They are a valuable experience both in terms of revision and sitting the assessment. A lot of students will be worried about the concept of sitting in the Hall and I want to reassure Year 8 and not let the panic overcome them. All we can ask is that students try their best and do what is asked of them. As the whole year will be in together behaviour is very important. It will be treated similar to a GCSE exam and any disturbance will be dealt with severely.

Uniform

We have changed the uniform to reflect the summer months so blazers are not mandatory this term. Students do however have to wear their ties and shirts tucked in. A large number of students are arriving at school with no tie. If a tie goes missing or is damaged, it needs replacing. Shirts also need to be tucked in at all times. Negative points will be given to students with incorrect uniform and detentions can occur very quickly. Please remind your child about these standards.



Skirts and leggings are also becoming an issue. Skirts need to be tailored and knee length. We have found that some girls are rolling their skirts up and readjusting the height of skirt after being told about it. If this is persistent, students will need to change into school trousers or sit in isolation.

Equipment

Being organised is vital for making good progress. This term we have seen a big increase in the amount of students turning up to school missing equipment and even without a bag. Students will always need a bag. This stops learning in the classroom and creates unnecessary issues. Please check in with your child that they have the full equipment. The full list is available on the school website and replacement equipment can be bought through the school library.

Year 8 lunch time change

Please be aware that now Year 11 have gone onto study leave, we have made the decision to move Year 8 lunch time to 1:30pm. Students in Year 8 will now have their lunch after their period 4 lesson rather than their period 3 lesson. Students were made aware of this in assembly this week, and the change will come into effect on Monday 20th May.
