# HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

We are making changes to our behaviour system as the current policy needs refining. The vast majority of our students behave extremely well every day which is reflected in the fact we are one of only 20 National Behaviour Hub Lead Schools. Under the current system staff have to manually input rewards points which sometimes means that students who are doing well don't get the recognition that they deserve.

Under the new system, all students will automatically receive four attitude to learning (ATL) points for each lesson that they attend, as long as they're working well and trying their best. These points will lead to termly rewards and also allow students to access our new end of year rewards trips which we have planned for next year. I've explained the new system in detail to all the students in assemblies and we're going to be consulting them in the weeks ahead regarding what meaningful rewards they would like to be given.

There are several additional changes which we're making to the policy. We are phasing in the changes so some basic ones will take place next week including increasing the length of detention to one hour. The rest will be implemented in September. From next week, if a student fails to attend a one hour detention it will be increased to an hour and a half the next evening. We have simplified what students can receive a detention for and the list is as follows:

- Removal from lesson
- Weekly ATL score falling below a certain value (determined during the summer term three weeks)
- 5 x lack of equipment
- 2 x PE kit not brought in
- 3 x late to lesson
- Late to school
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Detentions will run from 3- 4pm Monday – Thursdays and the 1.5 hour detentions will run until 4.30pm on the same evenings.

We are partially launching the system now as we want to get four weeks of data so that we can then decide the criteria for students to qualify for the end of term rewards in the autumn. I am looking forward to reading the students suggestions regarding the rewards they would like us to put in place – they will be completing a survey over the next two weeks. In the interim any student achieving 380 points on more between now and the end of term will be entered into a prize-draw on the last day of term.



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It's an exciting time in the school at the moment and we are looking forward to implementing this new system which will ensure that the vast majority of students are rewarded and recognised for the effort they are putting in.
