Year 9 Immunisations

The Schools Immunisation Team will be visiting school on 30th January 2025 to deliver the Year 9 Diphtheria, Tetanus and Polio (DTP) and Meningitis (Men ACWY) Immunisations.

How to give or refuse consent.

• Go to the website below or click on the following link. This will take you to the online teenage booster vaccination form.

• Enter the unique school code for your child's school. The code for Pudsey Grammar School is EE108079 (please ensure you enter all letters and numbers).

Important: If you do not wish your child to receive the vaccinations, you are still required to complete the "refusal section" on the form so that we understand your wishes. If we do not receive a consent or refusal form, your child will be given an opportunity to consent for themselves on the day after being assessed by a nurse as Gillick competent to do so.

PROTECTING YOUR CHILD AGAINST SERIOUS DISEASES

In Year 9 your child is offered two vaccinations as part of the UK routine immunisation schedule. These are the Meningitis ACWY vaccine which helps to protect against Meningitis and Septicaemia, and the DTP (teenage booster) which helps to protect against Diphtheria, Tetanus and Polio. Your child may also be offered the MMR vaccine to protect against Measles, Mumps and Rubella if they did not receive this when they were younger.

You will receive an email confirmation when your child has received their vaccination(s) which will include information and advice about common reactions your child may experience.

It is essential that students attend their allocated meeting slots. Most students will have received a slip during Form time with this on. This ensures there is sufficient time to discuss entry requirements for specific courses and to select subjects within the appropriate option blocks.

In cases where subject choices clash, students will be asked to select an alternative. While these choices are not final and there is some flexibility at this stage, it is important that students have carefully considered their options and discussed them at home before their interview.

Additionally, students have received an overview of the January mock exams. Mock exams commence on the 13th January. This timetable allows them to highlight which exams they will sit, on what day, and at what time. Please encourage them to use this to plan their revision effectively.
