HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

I met with Rachel Reeves MP earlier today. This is the first time we have met since Ms Reeves was appointed Chancellor of the Exchequer and the funding for our Sixth Form building project was withdrawn by the Department for Education. Ms Reeves explained that one of the main issues facing the current Government was unfunded spending commitments made under the previous administration. We discussed the challenges facing schools at the moment and the conversation was a productive one. Ms Reeves is aware that our school is extremely popular, and I am looking forward to working with her over the coming years ahead to further develop our facilities.

Ms Reeves has invited me and two of our Year 11 students down to London later this spring where we will be given a tour of Parliament, and we will then visit 11 Downing Street. Ms Reeves also offered to talk to our Sixth Form students and visit the school for a tour.

We have always taken pride in having good relationships with our local MPs so I was pleased that despite the recent setback regarding the Sixth Form building, my meeting with Rachel Reeves was a productive one.

The figures for the applications for Year 7 starting secondary school in September were released recently and we remain extremely heavily oversubscribed with over 800 applications in total for 215 places in Year 7 this September. Out of these a total of 353 applications made us their first choice, which is the highest this has ever been. We are pleased that our school remains extremely popular in our local community.
