Either: February 1 & 2 or February 8 & 9 (an email with student groups has been sent out).

9am – 3pm each day

Venue: Wike Scout Camp, Backstone Gill Ln, Wike, Leeds LS17 9JS

On one day, students will do a circular approx. 14km training walk with the Turnballs. On the other day they will do indoor and outdoor training at the Scout Camp Site. This will



cover: First Aid & Emergency procedures kit, safe use of camping stoves (provided) and expedition food planning and route Planning. They will bring a training book home from this with their planning notes.

For both days they need to:

Wear clothes suitable for potentially muddy and cold conditions - check the weather forecast beforehand.

Bring packed lunch/drinks – enough for the whole day/snacks (not pot noodles - there will not be a kettle!).

On their walking day they also need:

Good walking shoes or walking boots - they are walking a long way! Trainers are fine as long as they have thick, sturdy, supportive soles. They will get wet and muddy. Waterproof coat and trousers, warm layers, hats and gloves.

On their on-site training day they also need:

A pen

Clothes suitable for lying on a floor (for first aid).

Arrange to share lifts

Arrive on time

Come prepared to work hard.

And finally, the car park is in a loop. Can we ask that you drop off and leave reasonably promptly as it is not a big loop and there will be a lot of people on the site.
