HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

You may have seen earlier this week that a new report was published by the University of Birmingham which investigated the use of mobile phones in schools by children and how it affected them. The study found that there was no difference between schools who operate a complete ban on mobile phones and those who allow limited use at social times. Students' sleep, classroom behaviour, exercise or how long they spend on their phones overall seems to be no different for schools with complete phone bans and those (like us) who allow their use at break and lunchtimes.

We have always taken the view that phones are a complete distraction in lessons so they are automatically confiscated if students are using them. However, smartphones are now a key part of most people's lives and will remain so for the rest of their lives, so we firmly believe that rather than banning them completely and essentially ignoring the issue, our role is to ensure students understand when it is appropriate and when it is not appropriate to use them. This is a key skill for working life as an adult but also when we are with family and friends – we all know the irritation that can be caused in any relationship if someone is distracted by their phone.

Excessive smartphone use outside of school seemed to cause issues with some children and the study emphasised the importance of educating children about this aspect and encouraging them to reduce their time on their phone. As I'm sure you will all know, this is easier said than done but it was encouraging to see this report which states that simply completely banning them in schools at all times is not the answer.




Year 9 Progress Reports
