
### YEAR 8

This week in assembly, Mrs Gough highlighted the importance of reading, especially with World Book Day approaching on 6th March. To support this, we would like to remind you that on the school website, under the Parental Information section, you will find a Literacy page. This includes a Year 7 and 8 Reading List that offers fantastic recommendations for your child. Additionally, students have access to the Reading Cloud via their RM Unify tiles, which provides book suggestions and allows them to reserve and renew books easily.

Encouraging your child to read at home can sometimes feel challenging, but there are several ways you can help foster a love for reading. Here are a few tips:

- Let Your Child Choose: Encourage your child to explore books from our ageappropriate reading list and allow them to choose what interests them.
- Establish a Reading Routine: Create a consistent reading time, such as before bed or after school, to make reading a regular habit.
- Discuss What They're Reading: Show interest in what your child is reading by having open conversations about their books. Share any books you've enjoyed, too, to spark their curiosity.
- Embrace Digital Reading: Some children may prefer digital books over traditional ones. Encourage the use of e-books and audiobooks if they find them engaging.





• Encourage, Don't Pressure: Let your child explore reading at their own pace. If they're not interested in reading at a particular moment, avoid pressuring them. Allow their love for reading to grow naturally.
